

Bearing Witness in Jerusalem

Acts 21:1-27-23:11

- The closing chapters of Acts are very important in discerning Luke's overarching purposes in writing this book
 - He wants to demonstrate that Christianity is the true expression of Biblical Judaism
 - He wants to show that Christianity is no political threat to Roman authority
 - He wants us to see continuity between Jesus' ministry and the ministry of the Apostles
 - He wants us to see the unshakable Providence of God in all events that occur
- Today we will look at Paul's arrest and his first defense before the Jews where Luke emphasizes <u>the continuity between Christianity and Biblical</u> Judaism

I. Accused and Arrested (21:27-36)

- 1) The Jewish Accusations
 - a. Teaching against Jews/Jewish culture
 - b. Turning against the Law of Moses
 - c. Teaching against the Temple
 - d. Bringing a Gentile into the Temple
 - i. False in a strictly literal sense
 - ii. True in a broader theological sense!! (cf. Eph 2:11-22)
- 2) The Biblical Parallels
 - a. Same accusations made against Jesus
 - b. Same accusations made against Stephen
 - i. Ironic twist that Saul the Pharisee has now switched places with Stephen
 - ii. Irony that Paul is 'rescued' from certain death by the Roman authorities

- 1. Claudius Lysias mistakes Paul for an Egyptian assassin!! (sicarii)
- 2. Paul is given an opportunity to speak publicly in his own defense

II. Defense Before the Jews (21:37-23:10)

- 1) Testimony in the Temple
 - a. Christianity is not 'anti-Jewish'
 - i. Speaks in Aramaic
 - ii. Identifies with the Jewish crowd
 - iii. Identifies with their religious 'zeal'
 - iv. Gives his 'Jewish' credentials
 - v. Emphasizes the ministry of Ananias "a devout man according to the law, well spoken of by all the Jews" (v. 12)
 - vi. Prayer and vision was in the Temple
 - b. Christianity is the fulfillment of Judaism
 - i. Proclaims Jesus of Nazareth as the risen and ascended Messiah
 - ii. Proclaims salvation for the Gentiles in accordance with the Old Testament
- 2) Trial before the Sanhedrin
 - a. Comparison and Contrast with Jesus
 - i. Both appeared before the High Priest
 - ii. Jesus turns the other cheek, while Paul loses his temper for a moment
 - b. Paul uses this opportunity to evangelize the Pharisees

III. Divine Comfort (23:11)

- 1) Encouragement
- 2) Commendation
 - a. Paul's suffering was for a purpose
 - b. Paul had fulfilled his mandate by testifying accurately to the truth about Jesus
- 3) Motivation onward to Rome!
