Peace for the Anxious - Ruth 1:1-22

- Chapter 1 ended with a few faint glimmers of hope in an otherwise hopeless situation. Naomi and Ruth are now back in Bethlehem but their future survival hangs in the balance – these two widows are in desperate need of God's peace

- Chapter 2 contains several surprises that bring peace to the anxious hearts of Naomi and Ruth

I. Ruth's Surprising Initiative (vv. 1-7)

- 1) Ruth's Determination to Provide
 - a. A request to 'glean'
 - i. God's special concern for the poor
 - ii. God's legal provision Deut. 24:19-22
 - iii. Not everyone welcomed gleaners!
 - b. A display of Providence
 - i. Tongue in cheek statement from the narrator: "as luck would have it..." (v. 3)
 - ii. God leads Ruth to a field belonging to Boaz, one of her husband's relatives
- 2) Ruth's Bold Initiative
 - a. An unusually bold request to 'glean and gather among the sheaves' (v. 7)
 - b. An impressive work ethic!

II. Boaz's Surprising Response (vv. 8-16)

- 1) A Godly Businessman
 - a. He is a man of significant wealth "mighty man of valour" (v. 1)
 - b. His character is reflected in his Godglorifying speech (v. 4)
 - c. He is well respected by his employees
- 2) A Generous Israelite
 - a. Goes above and beyond the call of duty
 - i. Gives permission for Ruth to 'glean' alongside his own workers
 - ii. Offers his personal protection
 - iii. Provides water to drink
 - iv. Provides a cooked meal with leftovers

- v. Arranges for the workers to drop a few stalks from the bundles
- b. Boaz gives all of the glory back to God where it belongs! (vv. 11-12)

Application:

- God often distributes blessing through godly men and women- how can you demonstrate God's love and kindness to someone in need this Christmas?

III. God's Surprising Grace (vv. 17-23)

- 1) God is the Silent Actor in this Drama!
 - a. Providence causing all things to work for the good of those who love Him
 - b. Provision for our needs
 - i. 1 Ephah = approx 20L of grain!
 - ii. Ruth is overwhelmed (v. 10), and Naomi's hope is restored (v. 20)
- 2) An Even Greater Story of Grace...
 - a. Boaz is an Old Testament 'type' who prefigures Jesus Christ
 - b. Ruth is an Old Testament 'type' who prefigures the Christian Church

Application:

- No matter what our circumstances may be, we can find peace in the fact that our God is working behind the scenes for our good and for His glory
- God's spiritual provision is infinitely more important than His material provision! Are you experiencing the peace of God that comes through a personal relationship with Jesus Christ??
