

Your Heart and Your Treasure

Malachi 3: 6-12

I. Robbing God (vv. 6-10a)

- 1) A Problem with the Heart
 - a. The root issue Malachi is confronting in these verses is a heart issue
 - b. Israel had turned away from God, and God had 'turned away' from Israel
 - i. God was withholding His blessing as a form of discipline Deuteronomy 28
 - ii. Context of this dispute is most likely crop failure and a poor economy v. 11
- 2) A Problem with the Pocketbook
 - a. God accuses Israel of stealing from Him!
 - b. Israel had stopped paying their tithe
 - i. Tithing (giving 10%) was a principle that pre-dates the Mosaic Law (Gen 14, 28)
 - ii. Tithing became mandatory for Israel under the Mosaic Covenant
 - 1. Tithing to supporting the ministry of Levites and Priests Numbers 18
 - 2. Tithing every third year to support the poor Deuteronomy 14:28-29
 - 3. Tithing to celebrate Deut 14:23
 - iii. Nehemiah Enforces the Tithe Nehemiah 10:36-39, 13:10-12
- 3) Are Christians Required to Tithe?
 - a. Tithing was part of the Ceremonial/ Civil Law of Israel which is no longer binding
 - b. New Testament does not 'lower the bar', but assumes financial generosity/ self-sacrifice
 - i. To support gospel proclamation through Missionaries and the Local Church (1 Corinthians 9:14)

- ii. To meet the needs of the poor (Acts 6:1, 2 Corinthians 8:14, 1 Timothy 5:16)
- iii. To give regularly and in proportion to what we earn (1 Corinthians 16:2)
- iv. To give willingly (2 Corinthians 9:7)
- v. To give sacrificially (2 Corinthians 8:1-5)

"Tithing is like a toddler's first steps: They aren't his last or best steps, but they're a good start. Once you learn to ride a bike you don't need the training wheels. Once you learn to give, tithing becomes irrelevant." - Randy Alcorn

Application: There is a deep connection between the spiritual condition of our heart and the way that we spend our money (cf. Matthew 6:21). What do your current financial priorities indicate about your current spiritual priorities?

II. Robbing Ourselves (vv. 10b-12)

- 1) By Robbing God, Israel was also Robbing Herself
 - a. Disobedience brought God's discipline
 - b. Israel felt (wrongly) that they couldn't afford to tithe 10% of their income
 - c. God challenges Israel to take a step of faith!
- 2) How Can we Rob Ourselves as Christians?
 - a. Becoming overly attached to this world (Matthew 19:22; 2 Tim 4:10; 1 John 2:15)
 - b. Finding our security in wealth rather than trusting fully in God (1 Timothy 6:17)
 - c. Not experiencing the joy of blessing others as God has blessed us (Acts 20:35)
 - d. Making friends in heaven (Luke 16:9)
 - e. Sow sparingly, reap sparingly (2 Cor 9:6)

Application: What practical changes do we need to make in order to line up our financial priorities with the priorities of God and His Kingdom?
