The Cost of Obedience

Mark 6:1-30

I. The Cost for Jesus (vv. 1-6)

- 1) Rejection in His Hometown
 - a. This is probably Jesus' second visit to His home Synagogue in Nazareth (cf. Luke 4)
 - i. On the first visit, initial amazement with Jesus' gave way to murderous rage
 - ii. The second visit reveals their stubborn unbelief in the face of abundant proof
 1. Can't deny His wisdom and power
 2. Offended by His 'blue-collar' identity
 3. Offended by the sordid rumours surrounding His birth – "Son of Mary" was intended to be an insult!
 4. An embarrassment to His own family
 - b. Their stubborn unbelief amazes Jesus (v. 6)
- 2) Judgment upon His Hometown
 - a. Not many miracles performed in Nazareth
 - b. Jesus' omnipotence/ divinity is not at all limited by the extent of human faith
 - i. Numerous examples in New Testament Gospels of Jesus healing various people apart from their personal faith in Him
 - ii. Jesus 'could not' do miracles in Nazareth because he 'would not' do miracles there!

Application:

- Are you 'scandalized' or embarrassed by Jesus Christ and His message?? The Biblical Jesus has always been a source of deep offense for the unbelieving world, but for those of us who know and love Him, the 'stone of stumbling' has become a precious cornerstone – 1 Peter 2:4-8

II. The Cost for the Apostles (vv. 7-13, 30)

- 1) Called by Jesus in order to be Sent by Jesus
 - a. An Echo of Passover / Exodus (cf. Ex 12:11)
 - i. Israel left Egypt with a few simple items: belt, sandals, staff
 - ii. Apostles are sent out on their mission trip with a similar list of items
 1. Taught them full dependence on God
 2. These stringent instructions were temporary – not a pattern for modern missionaries (cf. Luke 22:35-37)
 3. Confirming evidence that these 12 Apostles are a reconstituted 'Israel' -Shaking off the dust - signifies that non-believing Jews are in the same spiritual situation as non-believing Gentiles
 - b. A Foreshadowing of Pentecost (cf. Acts 2)
 - i. A trial run for the time when Jesus would pass the baton to His Apostles/ Church
 - ii. Miracles confirmed the message

Application:

- Like the first Apostles, we have been called to salvation by Jesus Christ in order to be sent back into a lost world with His life-changing truth.
- Like the Apostles, we must learn to depend on God in all things and learn to count the cost of rejection.

III. The Cost for John the Baptist (vv. 14-29)

- 1) John was not Afraid to Speak Truth to Power
 - a. Called King Herod to repent of his sin!
 - b. Unrighteous men are always made uncomfortable by those who stand for truth
- 2) Beginning of a new Era: The New Covenant
 - a. John - last of the Old Testament Prophets
 - b. Death of John the Baptist prefigures the death of a far greater Prophet - Jesus Christ
