<u>Crumbs for the 'Dogs'</u> - Mark 7:24 - 8:9

On the heels of Jesus' confrontation with the Pharisees about eating food with 'unclean' hands comes three incidents involving Jesus' interaction with 'unclean' people. Jesus has already declared all foods to be clean (v. 19) and now He is declaring a far more important truth- it is not ethnicity that counts but faith in Jesus Christ!

I. The Syro-Phoenician Woman (7:24-30)

- 1) Journey north to Tyre and Sidon (Lebanon)
 - a. Residents of Tyre were bitter enemies of the Jewish people (*cf* Isaiah 23)
 - b. Jezebel the most wicked woman in the Bible came from this region (1 Kings 16:31)
 - c. Jesus is following in the footsteps of Elijah (1 Kings 17) and going to a place where no Pharisee would dare to follow
- 2) A Gentile Mother's Desperate Plea
 - a. She has already heard about Jesus (*cf* 3:7-8)
 - b. Her daughter is possessed by a demon
 - c. Vivid Contrast with the Pharisees
 - i. Desperate, Unclean, Gentile, Female, Idol Worshipper – *"even Levi the tax collector must have raised his eyebrows at this woman."* – James Edwards
 - ii. This Gentile woman casts herself at the feet of the Jewish Messiah, while the Jewish religious leaders plots to kill Him!
 - d. Her stubborn persistence in seeking Jesus' help for her daughter is a model for us!
- 3) Jesus Tests her Faith
 - a. Although Jesus deeply loves this Canaanite woman he assumes for a moment the selfrighteous and racist posture of His disciples

- i. Gentiles were called 'dogs' an unclean animal that ate garbage and carrion
- ii. Jesus is testing this woman and teaching His disciples – exposing sinful prejudice
- b. She passes Jesus' test with flying colours!
 - i. This woman understands that she has no claim on God's mercy and grace
 - ii. The Pharisees rejected the bread of life but this woman is satisfied with a crumb!
 - iii. Jesus commends her faith (Matt 15:28, *cf* Luke 4:25-26)

II. A Deaf Man from the Decapolis (vv. 31-37)

- 1) Return to the Decapolis
 - a. Jesus takes a 120 mile trip through Lebanon and Syria – probably took several months
 b. Decapolis was a Gentile region where Jesus
 - had already healed the demoniac (ch. 5)
- 2) A Messianic Miracle
 - a. Rare Greek word is used by Mark to describe this man's condition *mogilalos*
 - b. Fulfillment of Isaiah 35: 5-7 happens in a very unexpected way outside of Israel
- 3) A Picture of Salvation God must open our ears to the gospel and free our tongues to praise Him

III. Feeding a Mixed Multitude (8:1-9)

- 1) Feeding of 5000 happened in Jewish territory
- 2) Feeding of 4000 happened in Gentile territory
 - a. The Good Shepherd shows compassion to a mixed multitude of Jews and Gentiles
 - b. Foreshadowing of the New Covenant Church where the dividing wall is broken down
 - Fulfillment of Israel's long neglected missionary mandate – Isaiah 49:6; Psalm 67
