The Sanctity of Marriage - Mark 10:1-12

I. Pharisees' Trap Concerning Divorce (vv. 1-2)

- 1) Jesus is now marching south toward His crucifixion in Jerusalem
- 2) Pharisees attempt to ensnare Jesus with a question on 'divorce'
 - a. Question is really whether a man could divorce "for any cause" (cf. Matthew 19:3)
 - b. Backdrop of the question is ongoing Rabinnic debate about the specific meaning of "indecency" in Deutermony 24:1
 - i. Rabbi Shammai (conservative view) divorce only allowed in cases of adultery
 - ii. Rabbi Hillel (liberal view) divorce allowed for almost any reason
 - c. Pharisees know the answer to this question could easily land Jesus in hot water
 - i. John the Baptist was recently beheaded for criticizing the divorce of King Herod
 - ii. A lenient answer on divorce would cost him the support of more conservative Pharisees who followed Rabbi Shammai

II. Jesus' Teaching Concerning Divorce (vv. 3-11)

- 1) Jesus Response to the Pharisees (vv. 3-9)
 - a. Jesus tests the Pharisees with a loaded question: 'What did Moses command you?'
 - i. Jesus knows there is no command in the Mosaic Law concerning divorce
 - ii. Pharisees are forced to admit that Moses only <u>permitted</u> divorce
 - b. Jesus recognizes divorce only as a divine concession for human sinfulness
 - i. Divorce was never God's intention

- ii. Divorce in the Mosaic Law was God's way of graciously protecting women who would otherwise be destitute
- c. Jesus primary concern is God's original plan and intention for marriage
 - i. Marriage is between one man and one woman – Genesis 1:27
 - 1. Polygamy was not God's original intention for marriage & sexuality
 - 2. Homosexuality was not God's intention for marriage & sexuality
 - ii. Marriage is permanent joining of two people into one Genesis 2:24
- 2) Jesus' Response to His Disciples (vv. 10-12)
 - a. The Disciples' question in v. 10 reveals that they had the more 'liberal' view on divorce
 - i. Jesus teaches the general principle that divorce frequently leads to adultery
 - ii. Two Biblical exceptions:
 - 1. God permits divorce & remarriage when one spouse is guilty of 'porneia' (sexual immorality) Matthew 19:9
 - 2. God permits divorce/remarriage when a Christian is deserted-1 Cor 7:12-16
 - 3. Celibacy is the only Biblical option for the Christian who is divorced on non-biblical grounds 1 Cor 7:10-11

Applications:

- God gently embraces the victims of divorce and understands what it is like Jeremiah 3:8
- Divorce is not the unforgiveable sin there is forgiveness and grace even if you've failed
- We ought always to nurture our marriages and to seek reconciliation in every circumstance
- We should never choose a marriage partner lightly, or marry someone against the will of God
