### **History of Corinth and Paul's Letters**

Knowing the history between Paul and the Corinthian church really helps us to understand these verses and many other verses in the Corinthian letters. Here is a short chronology of the Corinthian church up to this letter of 2 Corinthians.

-Paul founded the Corinthian church on his second missionary journey. This is recorded in Acts 18. Paul spent almost two years in Corinth before returning to Antioch.

-After Paul left he heard of gross immorality in the church at Corinth and wrote them a letter calling the sinner to repent and instructing the church what to do about that man. We call this letter, which is mentioned in 1 Corinthians 5.9, the previous letter. It is now lost.

-The Corinthian church wrote a letter to Paul about the immorality problem and also asking a number of questions about their faith. <u>1 Corinthians</u> is a response to their letter and the ongoing problems.

-Timothy visited Corinth shortly after 1 Corinthians was sent to them as stated in 1 Corinthian 4.17 and 16.10. This was a bad experience for Timothy and the problems in Corinth grew worse with the coming of false apostles. The church was stirred by them and some in the congregation to rebel against Paul and his teaching.

-Paul who was in Ephesus at the time decided to make an <u>emergency visit</u> to Corinth instead of the visit he was planning after visiting Macedonia 1 Corinthians 16.5. We call this the <u>painful visit</u>. We have no record of this painful visit but it is implied by comments in 2 Corinthians 2.1 and 13.1.

-Paul's painful visit was not successful so he followed it up with a <u>severe letter</u> which is now lost and a <u>visit by</u> <u>Titus</u>. We know of this severe letter from 2 Corinthians 2.4 and 7.8. Paul also <u>cancelled any plans to visit Corinth</u> until he found out about the results of the severe letter and Titus' visit. 2 Corinthians 2.1.

-We see Paul's anxiety in 2 Corinthian 2.12-13. Titus and the letter were finally successful in bringing repentance and renewed allegiance to Paul and this is recorded in the thanks of 2 Corinthians 2.14 and 7.7.

-Paul could now make plans to visit Corinth a third time and to deal with any pockets of rebellion and the false apostles. Read 2 Corinthians 10 to 13.

### **Christian Integrity**

- 1) Paul's first appeal to the Corinthian church with regard to his integrity in his cancelled plans is to his conscience. 1.12-14
- <u>Paul's second appeal to the Corinthian church</u> with regard to his integrity in his cancelled plans is to the faithfulness of God to them through his preaching. 1.15-22
- 3) Paul's third appeal to the Corinthian church with regard to his integrity in his cancelled plans is to the witness of God. 1.23-2.4

This is the application we can take home today. We are not called to integrity in order to parade ourselves as people of integrity but our integrity is a reflection of the gospel that we claim and proclaim. We must strive to live with a clear conscience before God, to speak a message that is faithful to God's truth, and work for the joy and increasing faith of others with a motive of love, even if that sometimes means rebuke and pain for a short time. We can do this by God's grace working in us.
