“In virtually every preindustrial culture – sons were expected to ‘imitate’ their fathers. Vocationally, if the father was a baker, the son would likely become a baker; if the father was a sheep farmer, that is what the son would almost certainly become. The son was expected to carry on family values, family heritage, family name. With that cultural expectation controlling his analogy, Paul argues that if he became the ‘father’ to the Corinthians, they ought to imitate him... He does not expect them to suffer in exactly the same way he does; he does not demand that they all become apostles or plant churches in distant lands. What he does expect of them is that they will imitate his values, his stance with respect to the world, his priorities, and his valuation of the exclusive centrality of the gospel of the crucified Messiah.”

Smug Spirituality

1 Corinthians 4:6-21

I. Paul's Apostolic Rebuke – vv. 6-13

- 1) A 'Superiority Complex' – vv. 6-7
 - a. Trespassing Biblical Boundaries
 - i. Their boasting in leaders was unbiblical
 - ii. Their criticism of leaders was unbiblical
 - iii. Paul warns them not to go 'beyond what was written' (cf. 1:19-20, 31; 2:19-21)
 - b. Forgetting God's Grace
 - i. The Corinthians were acting as though they were superior to one another
 - ii. Paul reminds them that a Christian has nothing apart from God's grace!

Application:

- There is no room for boasting and arrogance within the Church. If we truly understand the depth of our sinfulness and the immensity of God's grace we will boast in the cross of Christ and in nothing else.

- 2) Smug Self-Satisfaction – vv. 8-13
 - a. The Corinthian Church had embraced an '*over-realized eschatology*'
 - i. They were acting as though the Kingdom of God had fully arrived when in fact it had not!
 - ii. Paul reminds them that we live in an age of tension between the 'now' of God's Kingdom and the 'not yet' of God's Kingdom
 - Triumphalism vs. Suffering
 - Arrogance vs. Humility
 - b. The Corinthians had become self-satisfied and blind to their spiritual poverty (cf. Rev 3:14-22)

Application:

- Unbiblical triumphalism remains a problem in the Church today: Prosperity Theology, Faith Healing, Sinless Perfectionism, 'Higher Life' teaching etc.

- We must learn to embrace suffering, tribulation and persecution as part of the normal Christian life. As Christians we should not foster a 'martyr complex' but neither should we expect to live a trouble-free life.

- Because the Western Church enjoys tremendous affluence and political protection we are particularly vulnerable to the Corinthian error. There is much we North Americans can learn from our impoverished and persecuted brethren around the world.

- Any Church that becomes spiritually smug and self-satisfied is ripe for the discipline of God

II. Paul's Fatherly Warning – vv. 14-21

- 1) Paul loves the Corinthians as their Father
 - a. He was a 'father' in the sense that many had come to faith in Christ through his preaching
 - b. Paul's words may seem harsh, but his motive is loving – a loving father warns his wayward children whenever they are in danger!
- 2) Paul wants the Corinthians to imitate his example
 - a. In Paul's culture a son was expected to follow in the footsteps of his father
 - b. Paul has been walking the road of humility and suffering and wants his Corinthian children to do the same (cf. 3 John 1:4)
- 3) Paul will use corrective discipline if necessary
 - a. He has already dispatched Timothy to Corinth
 - b. He plans to visit the Church in person
 - i. Paul is not afraid to confront troublemakers
 - ii. Paul will assess their spiritual maturity
 - iii. Paul does not want to use discipline, but he will spank the Corinthians if needed!

Application:

- Discipline in the home and in the Church is a reflection of God's Fatherly love (cf. Hebrews 12:6). Discipline is never pleasant, but sometimes it is the most loving and constructive thing that can be done.
